ELIGIBILITY

You must be 1) a high school senior or home-school equivalent, or 2) and under- graduate or graduate student 25 years or younger (as of 3/20/2019) enrolled in an accredited institution.

You must be:

- A Virginia resident or
- Related to a Virginia resident or to a member of the Virginia Mayflower Society.

You must at least a B grade point average or equivalent.

You must be sponsored by a current teacher or a member of the Virginia Mayflower Society.

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE \$1,620 SCHOLARSHIP

On or before the March 20, 2019 DEADLINE you must provide the Scholarship Committee with:

- 1. A brief resume.
- 2. A letter from your sponsor stating that he or she is your sponsor and including the name, address, E-mail/phone number for you and for the sponsor.
- 3. A copy of your academic transcript for the first half of 2019 and the prior two years.
- 4. An original essay of the subject below or no more than 1500 words in the MLA, APA or Chicago Manuel of Style. The essay must cite at least 5 print/web sources; DO NOT use Wikipedia and DO USE spell or grammar check.

Submissions may be made by hard copy of by e-mail.

Applicants will be judged on academic record, resume, and, predominately, on their essay.

A family member (child, niece/nephew or in-law) of a member of the Society's Board of Assistants or of the Scholarship Committee are ineligible
