Statement of the Sorority

The History of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated dates from November 12, 1922, when seven young school teachers organized the first chapter at Butler University in Indianapolis, Indiana. These young ladies sought a need for unity among college educated black women, on a predominantly white campus, to uphold the standards of scholarship, personality, character, purpose, self-respect, moral responsibility and rendering unselfish service to make a better society. Collective striving for these qualities of character was necessary for consistently good scholarship. A high standard in scholarship was, and is, directly related to our precepts of quality of character.

Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. is a predominately black, nonprofit, collegiate organization with its focus on community service. She is dedicated to the encouragement and promotion of high scholastic attainment and improvement of the quality of our lives and the society in which we live. Her purpose is expressed in the slogan "Greater Service, Greater Progress". Sigma ladies proudly display their colors of Royal Blue and Gold. Membership in Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. has been found to be a rewarding part of college life and continues for a lifetime.

The Delta Beta Sigma (Norfolk Alumnae) Chapter, Norfolk, VA was chartered on May 18, 1968. In keeping with the goals of the sorority, the focus of all projects is to provide service and funding to the community, local churches, and area schools. The chapter acts as the sponsoring alumnae chapter to the undergraduate chapters of the sorority at Old Dominion University (Theta Chi Chapter) and Norfolk State University (Gamma Nu Chapter).



Rosa Alexander Human Development Endowed Scholarship

Rosa M. Alexander was considered as one of Virginia's largest black business owners. She was also one of Norfolk Sate University's biggest supporters. In the late 1970s, she decided to start her own business. She had worked as an electronics mechanic trainee, helped manage a restaurant during the day, and also moonlighted as an office cleaner at night. She was definitely a multi skilled woman with many different facets to her approach to begin her career into entrepreneurship.

With her savings, Mrs. Alexander started a cleaning company; first with two contracts for a doctor's office and a day care center; then a contract with the then Norfolk Naval Base. Two years later, she was able to get a \$1.9 million contract with Norfolk Naval Shipyard. This was an amazing accomplishment for an African American woman as a businesswoman. Alexander prided her business on the quality of work that she could offer. She took it upon herself to instill her work ethic in her employees by continuing to work alongside them showing that although she had accomplished a lot in her gains but it was always better to help others and that she was never too good to work hard.

She not only was a business woman by trade but also was a philanthropist in the community. Although she did not attend college herself, she saw the great value in helping others accomplish their dreams of getting an education or having the affordability to attend college at Norfolk State University. She also took an active role in the community by acting as a key fundraiser for the Martin Luther Kings, Jr. Memorial in Norfolk, providing holiday meals for tenants in Park Place Apartments, purchasing books for the Norfolk State University Library.

She embodied the idea of acts of service throughout her life which was a testament to her life legacy that she lived. In 1983, NSU opened the three story Rosa M. Alexander Women's Hall where her picture hangs in its lobby. In 2003, at the age of 74, Rosa M. Alexander passed away after she had channeled so much energy towards being a part of philanthropic endeavors in the local community. In honor of her benevolence, the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc, Delta Beta Sigma Chapter's Rosa M. Alexander Human Development Endowed Scholarship was established November 10, 2006 which has provided financial assistance to many students matriculating at NSU.

GUIDELINES FOR AWARDING OF SCHOLARSHIP(S)

- 1. The applicant shall be an African American <u>female</u> who plans to enter a <u>four (4) year accredited college</u>, in any field of endeavor.
- 2. The applicant <u>must</u> be a **high school graduating senior from the Norfolk, Virginia Beach, or Chesapeake school system** at the time she submits the application.
- 3. The high school applicant <u>must</u> submit a <u>transcript of their high school academic record</u>, which shall include their <u>grade point average (GPA)</u> and their <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u> scores.
- 4. The applicant must apply through the Norfolk Alumnae (Delta Beta Sigma) Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. The application must be <u>RECEIVED via EMAIL</u> or <u>POSTMARKED at the address shown on the application</u> on or before <u>April 08, 2019 at 11:59PM</u>.
- 5. The applicant must include all of the following: scholarship application (completed and signed); high school transcript (including SAT and/or ACT scores); two (2) letters of recommendations; signed financial statement (page 2); and a recent picture of the applicant with name on the back of the photo.
- 6. Applications sent in via email can have photos attached as jpg or pdf file.
- 7. Failure to adhere to the stated guidelines will disqualify the applicant. **Applications missing one or more of these items are considered incomplete** and <u>WILL NOT BE REVIEWED</u>. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.
